#### Welcome to Washington, D.C.!

### Guided Sightseeing of Washington, D.C.

Your Tour Director, a licensed Washington, D.C. guide, introduces you to the sites where national policies and political reputations are formed and reformed daily. Take a photo in front of the White House, home of every U.S. president except George Washington. View the iconic Washington Monument from the grassy National Mall, and look for your home state at the National WWII Memorial, the first national memorial dedicated to all who served during World War II.

## **Arlington National Cemetery**

Observe the quiet dignity of Arlington National Cemetery, the final resting place of more than 200,000 veterans and their families. As you enter the Cemetery, you'll see the Women in Military Service for America Memorial, the only major national memorial honoring women who have served in the US Armed Forces. You'll also witness the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

# The United States Marine Corps Memorial

The cast bronze depiction of Marines raising the flag at Iwo Jima honors all those who have served in the Marine Corps since its inception in 1775.

#### **Walking Tour of Capitol Hill**

See the heart of our government on this walking tour of the U.S. Capitol Building (Grounds), the Library of Congress, and the Supreme Court.

## Albert Einstein Memorial

Situated in an elm and holly grove on the grounds of the National Academy of Sciences, the Albert Einstein Memorial stands as a tribute to the Nobel Prize-winning physicist.

#### **Explore the Tidal Basin**

Continue your exploration of Washington, D.C. with a walk around the Tidal Basin for some of the most impressive memorials in D.C.: the Jefferson Memorial, the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial, and the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial.

## **Breakfast in New Jersey**

#### Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island

Ferry to Liberty Island to marvel at the Statue of Liberty, a gift from France in honor of the French-U.S. alliance. Continue on to Ellis Island, which welcomed millions of immigrants to the New World around the turn of the century. Ellis Island is now the site of a museum chronicling the history of immigration.

#### Visit the 9/11 Memorial and Museum

Explore the global implications of the events of September 11, 2001 at the National September 11 Memorial Museum, which displays artifacts associated with the events of 9/11 while presenting stories of loss and recovery. Afterwards, visit the Memorial's twin reflecting pools, which sit within the footprints where the Twin Towers once stood.

#### **Photo Stop at Washington Square Park**

This 9.75 acre public park, located in the neighborhood of Greenwich Village, welcomes vistors and locals. The Washington Square Arch is located at the park's northern gateway.

## **Guided Sightseeing of Midtown**

Stroll down glamorous Fifth Avenue and marvel at the grandeur of St. Patrick's Cathedral, with its 26-foot-wide rose window and soaring Gothic spires. Finish your tour at the iconic Rockefeller Center.

Make a stop in 843-acre Central Park, an idyllic oasis in the concrete jungle. Join the more than 35 million annual visitors that make Central Park the most visited urban park in the United States.
